Why do Churches need Deacons?

If you've ever been stretched too thin, lacking time to accomplish everything on your "do list," you can appreciate the predicament the twelve disciples faced in Acts 6. The disciples were busy teaching, preaching, and healing, and, as a result, the fledgling church was growing rapidly. Fast growth inevitably led to some growing pains, including a complaint that some church members' physical needs were not being met. The church had been providing daily food for widows, who were dependent on this generosity, and the Greek-speaking Jews felt that their widows had been overlooked in the food distribution. This issue was causing division in the church.

Frustrated, the disciples realized that they simply couldn't do it all. "It would not be right for us to neglect the ministry of the word of God in order to wait on tables," they told the believers (Acts 6:2). So they asked the congregation to participate in a solution: "Brothers, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them and will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word" (v. 3-4). This meant that the Twelve could spend their time sharing what they had learned at the feet of Jesus, something they were uniquely qualified to do, and the Seven could minister to the physical needs of church members. While these men aren't actually called deacons in this passage, they certainly served in that role. They were model servants set aside by the entire congregation to fulfill a particular task—and that's exactly what deacons do in our church today.

The word "deacon" comes from the Greek word "diakonos," which means servant of the church. Deacons *serve* FBC New Bern by meeting physical and administrative needs, including hospital visits, contacts with church visitors, and ministering to an assigned group of church members as part of our Family Ministry Plan, as well as serving on deacon committees responsible for the church's financial plans, missions projects, and facilities planning, among other things. This, in turn, allows our pastors and ministry staff to prioritize their spiritual leadership responsibilities.

Our church selects 18 active deacons to serve three-year terms, so that six deacons rotate off and six are added each year. Our deacons who are being set apart and consecrated by this church family this year are: Dwayne Alligood, Josh Bell, Don Brinkley, Wayne Brown, Jennifer Emens, Charlotte Fuller, James Garner, Ken Gray, Joey Holton, Tracey Lorentzen, Kelsie McBride, Cathy Chitty Pike, Amy Price, Mona Quick, Kathy Swindell, Bobby West, Chuck White and Andy Wilkinson. Our congregation needs to love and support these deacons, as well as our pastors and staff, as they carry out their ministry.

As Sheree stated in a recent children's sermon about deacons, "A deacon is someone who serves others with joy." Let it be so!
